guys that will ultimately provide us with the drive and energy to see us through the next 25 years.



Modular Building Division Secure £1.8m Framework

Following the success of the Group's four year demountable building framework with Lincoln County Council, the division has beaten off stiff competition to secure a further two year framework with Derby County Council. The contract is for the delivery of modular classrooms to Derbyshire schools until 2015 with the first £140k order for commencement on 3rd June already being received. On the success Pat Richmond, Demountable Building Division Manager, comments "the technical knowledge we have built up in the area of this business since securing our first framework with Lincolnshire Council in 2010 has enabled us to put together a similarly successful bid" adding "I am delighted for the whole bid team and I am really looking forward to working closely with our new Derbyshire County Council client".

Work Completed on a New Visitor Centre for Bransby Home of Rest for Horses

Gelder Group have completed a £1.5 million project for Bransby Home for Rest Horses including extensive alterations and refurbishment to the existing building to create a new Visitor Centre, offices, meeting rooms, café and kitchen area. Alterations and refurbishment of the existing farmhouse and the construction of a new Animal Reception Centre with treatment rooms and stables. The contract commenced in October 2012 with the Visitor Centre having to be completed for an Easter opening which was achieved despite terrible winter weather which caused many setbacks. Contracts Manager Matt Hodgkins commented "Bransby Home for Rest Horses is situated just one mile from the Groups' Lincoln Head Office. The charity was started in 1968 and they now cater for around 360 neglected horses, ponies, donkeys and mules and we've thoroughly enjoyed working with their whole team who have been terrific".
