Lord McNally Visits to Clayfields House

Lord McNally, former Minister of State for Justice and current Chairman of the Youth Justice Board visited Clayfields Vocational Centre this week to see the innovative partnership between the Gelder Group and Clayfields House Secure Children's Home. The partnership is the first of its kind in the UK and provided Lord McNally with a great opportunity to see how private and public partnerships can revolutionise the youth justice system. Luke (17) who is a currently living at Clayfields House represented all of the partners throughout the tour of the unit including the Clayfields Vocational Centre which is under construction by the Gelder Group. Ian Smith, Head of Offender Training commented "Luke's professionalism and character was more powerful and persuasive in putting across the Clayfields vision for training and rehabilitation than any of the partners could have achieved". The Clayfields Vocational Centre is part of the Gelder Group's innovative Design-Build-Train programme and is due to open in early June and will provide a range of vocational provisions to the Youth Justice Board and local authority schools. 80% of learners attending the vocational centre will be referred from mainstream education from across the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire region.
