£5.2 Million Office Block Contract in Grimsby

The official 'Sod Cutting' ceremony took place on 14th August in advance of work commencing on the £5.2m build, four story office block on the derelict 'Cartergate' site in Grimsby. The construction of the new office block will take 12 months to complete and will then be handed over to it's new occupants 'Wilkin Chapman LLP', and be home to 250 employees. On commencing work Kevin Manterfield, Major Contracts Director comments "We look forward to working with North East Lincolnshire Council once again, on what, I'm confident, will be yet be another successful project."

£3.5 Million Improvements to Sir Francis Hill School, Lincoln

Internal renovation work at Sir Francis Hill School was completed in time to re-open the school in September although the £3.5 million upgrade will continue through to August 2016. The additional planned work consists of two extensions to the school, a new 'High-5' pitch, a new staff car parking area and a new playing area for the juniors. On the project Contracts Manager Simon Hope comments "The work to date has run very smoothly and with the preparations we've made to continue the work when the school is open, I'm confident that, whilst challenging, it will run just as smoothly".
