Prestigious Refurbishment Contract of Octagon Hall and Pavilion Gardens, Buxton

Gelder Group have secured a 51 week, £2.3m restoration contract for Octagon Hall & Pavilion Gardens in Buxton for High Peak Borough Council, which has been made all the more picturesque by the flurry of recent show.

The Grade II listed Pavilion Gardens complex currently attracts around one million visitors annually and dates back to 1870. It was originally designed by Sir Joseph Paxton and his pupil Edward Milner as a concert hall and winter garden and built on land donated by the 7th Duke of Devonshire.

Rob Porter, Senior Quantity Surveyor at Gelder Group comments: "The team at Gelder Group feel extremely privileged to have been chosen to deliver this high profile and interesting project", adding "we are all looking forward to working closely with High Peak Borough Council's project team to successfully deliver this scheme".

Maintenance Secure Southend-on-Sea Project

The Group's Maintenance Division continues to broaden its geographical trading boundaries, on this occasion with a contract for the NHBC in Southend-on-Sea, Essex. This project involves remedial works to the external fabric of a block of flats (pictured) situated on the sea front. The 15 week contract is due to commence in February and is the latest for a division that is fast developing an envious reputation for completing high value remedial works contracts nationally, with contracts in Manchester, Bristol, London, Newquay, Cornwall and now Southend-on-Sea, either on-going or completed.

£1.8m Contract for Training Facility


Gelder Group Major Contracts Division have secured a £1.8m contract with North Lincolnshire Council (NLC) to extend their CATCH site at Stallingborough to meet a growing demand for training from the energy, chemicals and engineering sectors. The new facility will increase provision for apprenticeships, helping local people to access long-term careers in these and other sectors. The work is due to start on site in January and expected to be complete in time for a student intake in September 2017.

The contract will be the second BIM (Building Information Modelling) project for NELC, again using 3D simulation clash avoidance techniques.

Our Major Contracts team have successfully handed over the Modal training facility in Immingham this month. The seven month project is a centre of excellence for the ports, energy and logistics sectors.
